## ADJUSTING OUR FOCUS

In 2023, we took some much needed time to readjust our focus on services and programs being offered to our blind and visually impaired clients.

The COVID 19 pandemic definitely hindered our vulnerable population from being part of group activities well after it was deemed safe. So we spent a lot of time in the past year developing programs to help us really feel connected again!

We were able to take clients to:

- participate in a walking group at Kirby Park
- find their zen through a series of yoga classes throughout the spring/summer
- shop the Wilkes-Barre Farmer's Market and at Boscov's Department Store
- jam out at the Rockin' the River Concert Series along the Susquehanna River



We were especially excited about the growth in our Supper and Support Group. Clients meet once a month and prepare a meal together, utilizing Vision Rehabilitation skills, and share it over great conversation—typically disclosing things that are going on in their lives, things they need advice on or things they want to celebrate with their friends. It is a wonderfully unintimidating option for someone new to vision loss, and often new to our agency to meet peers in a casual, fun way.



Northeast Sight Services proudly saw nearly 90 new clients this year. The opportunity to introduce them to quality services and programs was phenomenal.

We were also able to provide nearly 500 Independent In–Home Living Support Visits to clients in need. Independent Living Support services are designed to assist clients with personal business that includes assistance with balancing checkbooks, handling correspondence, filing applications for benefits and other essential tasks. This allows our clients to remain living independently in their homes.

One of our favorite programs year after year continues to thrive. Our Children's Vision Screenings help detect potential vision and eye health problems, often before symptoms are even noticed, for thousands of children in our service areas.

This year, we screened nearly 1,000 children for color blindness, which is a service most don't realize we provide with our screenings. And although there is no cure for color blindness, it is helpful for both parents and teachers to know in order to create visual cues for students to have a supportive learning environment.

All of our Children's Vision Screenings are free of charge and have been for over 50 years due to the generosity of individuals, like you. You understand just how important this service is to the children who attend these daycares, pre-schools and Kindergarten Registrations where we have the privilege to complete these screenings.

A new program that we were able to partner on this year was MY Work. MY Work was a collaboration with the City of Pittston and the Bureau of Blindness and Visual Services.

We were so excited to help offer this incredible opportunity to four young local students who spent four weeks working at various jobs in Pittston City. The students got to experience different job locations including: Pittston City Hall, the Greater Pittston Chamber of Commerce and the Pittston Memorial Library.

These young adults had an amazing summer meeting new people, working on a variety of different projects, and helping their community while participating in MY Work. We are thrilled to have the chance to replicate the program in Wilkes-Barre City in the Summer of 2024 and cannot wait to keep watching it grow!

## Wyoming Valley Run



Amongst all the wonderful things that happened in 2023, our hearts here at Northeast Sight Services broke a little when long time supporter, board member and volunteer Louis F. Goeringer passed away on November 21.


Lou graduated from Wyoming Seminary and Villanova University. After completing training in the Marine Corps, Lou was commissioned a 2nd Lieutenant and promoted to 1st Lieutenant 18 months later.

In 1957, he started working full-time for Bertels Metalware Co. in Kingston, PA, eventually becoming President/CEO. During his 50-year tenure at Bertels, the company grew from a small metal ware business to an international can company manufacturing decorative cans for the snack food industry and industrial cans for the lard and shortening trade.

In addition to Lou's business interests, he was truly community-minded, serving for over 20 years on the Greater Wilkes-Barre Chamber of Commerce's Board of Directors and serving as Commissioner for 40 years on the Luzerne County Housing Authority. He served on the Board of the Luzerne Foundation for over 25 years. At Misericordia University, Lou had been a member of the President's Council, head of the Theatre 3 Campaign, chair of the Annual Fund, and was elected to serve on the Board of Trustees. He was the past vice president of the Wyoming Seminary Alumni Association and was a two-term Treasurer of the Bear Creek Village Association. He served on the Villanova University Alumni Board of Governors, was the past President of the Northeastern PA Alumni Society, and received the Alumni Medal for Outstanding Service.

Lou served for over 30 years on our Board of Directors, in each officer capacity, including Chairman, and served on the Board of Trustees since its inception. He adored our Camp Sight program, sponsoring it and attending the wrap-up festivities each year. He and his wife, Florence were honored by Northeast Sight Services in 2016 with the Distinguished Community Service Award. Lou received the Association of Fundraising Professionals of Northeastern PA's Lifetime Achievement Award just days before his passing – he had been nominated by our Vice President of Development and Planned Giving, Amy Feldman.

A lifetime of commitment, dedication, and support to this organization-there will never be another like Lou. We were blessed to have him be a part of our lives and support this agency so passionately. He is missed tremendously and we will never forget his legacy.


